Primary Criteria	Given to a child by a caregiver with clear intent to injure	0	
	Given to a child by a caregiver intentionally and knowingly, even if intent was not to injure	0	
	Drug or chemical exposure to the child was not intentional on the part of the caregiver, but the involved drug was part of a caregiver's involvement in illicit drug use or sale	0	
	Caregiver's own intoxication led to supervisory neglect resulting in a child's poisoning injury	1	100%
Additional Considerations that May Merit a CPS Report	Child has been treated for THC ingestion on more than one occasion raising concern for a pattern of at-risk neglect	0	
	Caregiver's response to toxic exposure is judged to neglectfully place child at undue risk of secondary injury (i.e. failure to seek prudent care)	4	100%
	Caregiver placed medication, chemical, or drug into an unusual setting in which child injury was an entirely predictable consequence (i.e. storing methadone in a child's sippy-cup in refrigerator)	0	
	Toxic exposure is judged to have resulted in a near-fatality or in impairment resulting in ICU-level care	19	100%
	No plausible exposure pathway provided by caregiver	33	94%
