Dear Dr. Luisa Fernanda Atunes Ortega,

On behalf of the entire Boston Children's Hospital team, we are extremely pleased to offer you a full-time position as a Research Fellow in Neurology at Boston Children's, reporting to Dr. Tobias Loddenkemper. Although this is a full-time position, your salary will be fully paid by MEDQUIRURGICOS SAS, so you will have "Associated Personnel" or non-employee status at Boston Children's. Your United Healthcare insurance through GBG will be paid for by MEDQUIRURGICOS SAS. This fellowship will be for a 2-year period contingent upon continually demonstrating satisfactory performance and the continued availability of funding from MEDQUIRURGICOS SAS. Your tentative start date is October 2, 2023.

As a postdoctoral trainee in my laboratory, your primary responsibilities will be related to acute seizure management and status epilepticus research, and multimodal seizure monitoring, detection, prediction, and prevention. Specifically, you will research acute seizure management, including work on natural language processing to identify patients with status epilepticus and acute seizures and seizure action plan improvement for patients at risk of status epilepticus. Related modalities for seizure detection, among others, will include evaluation and analysis of seizure diaries, actigraphy, EDA, photoplethysmography, EEG, and video, among others. These responsibilities include but are not limited to patient screening, enrollment, data management, collection and entry as well as analysis, manuscript writing and submission as well as presentation of data, as well as participation in team meetings, and additional laboratory research projects.

Karen Caballero will contact you about requirements needed to bring you on as associated personnel, as well as any visa paperwork required. As an important reminder, your status as associated personnel and start date are contingent upon the timely completion and submission of all successful completion of Human Resources and Occupational Health requirements, including a standard criminal background screening, reference checks, proof of your eligibility to work in the United States and vaccinations.
