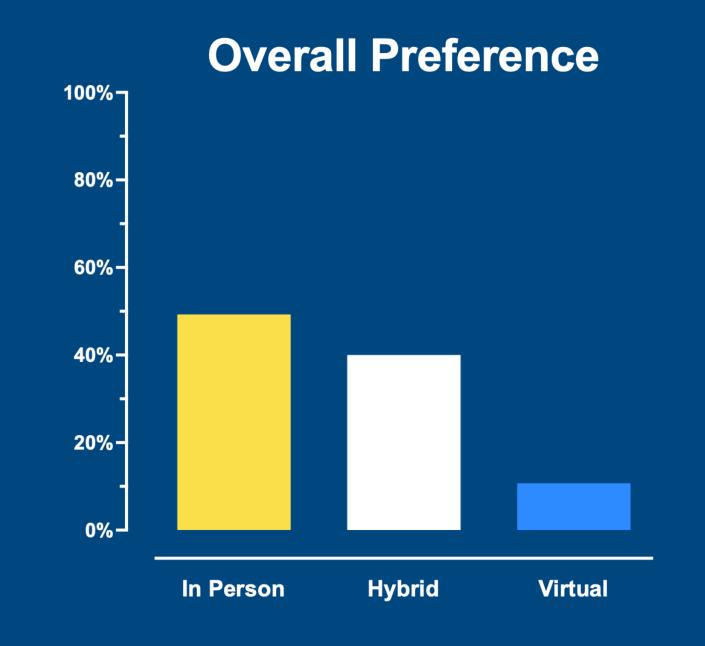

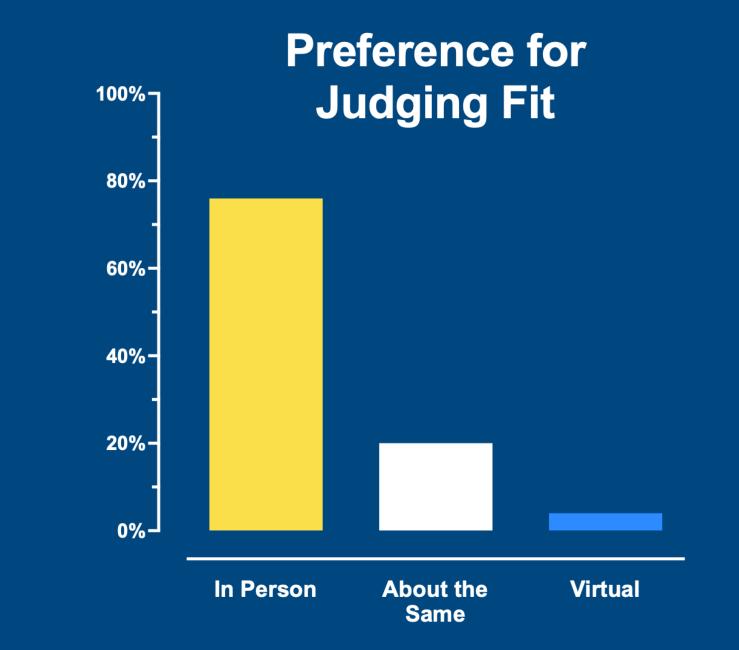

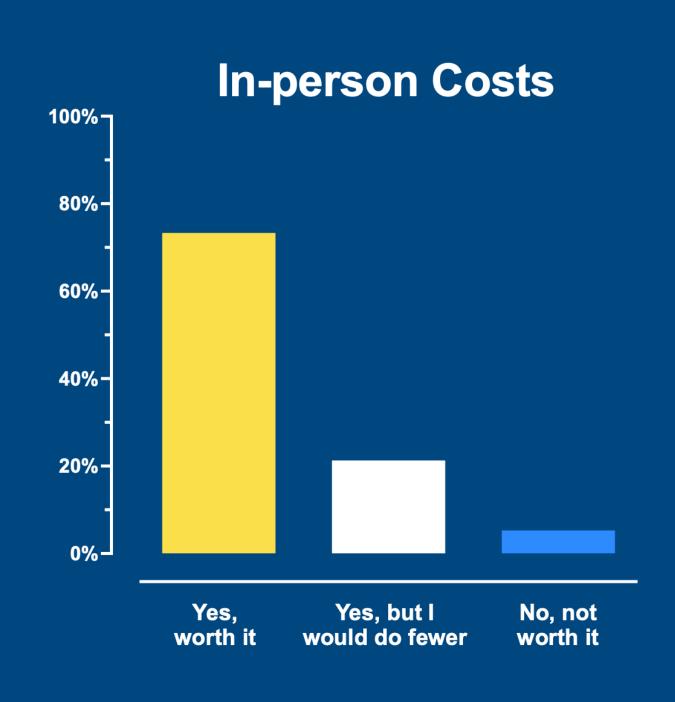

Applicants now strongly favor in-person or hybrid format interviews vs. virtual, and said in-person was worthwhile despite rising equity concerns







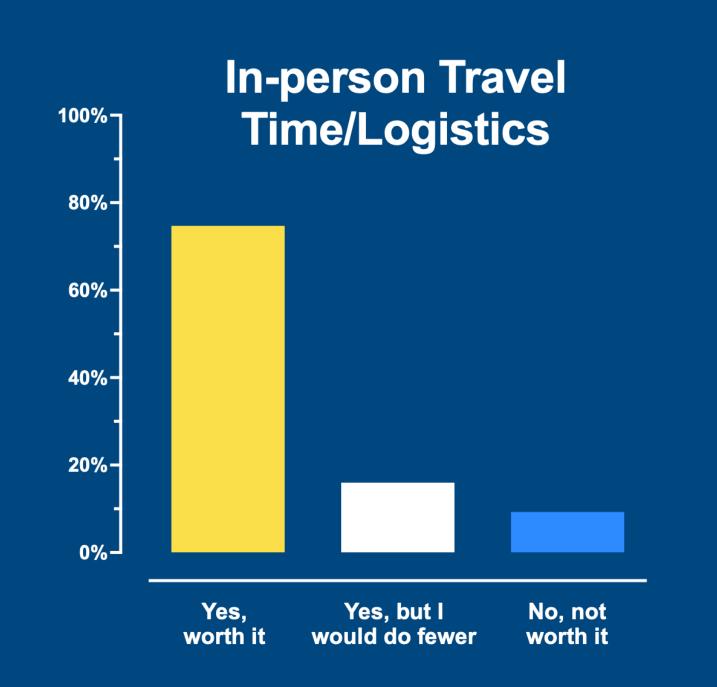


Figure Interview Costs

19% <u>declined</u> an in-person interview due to costs alone!

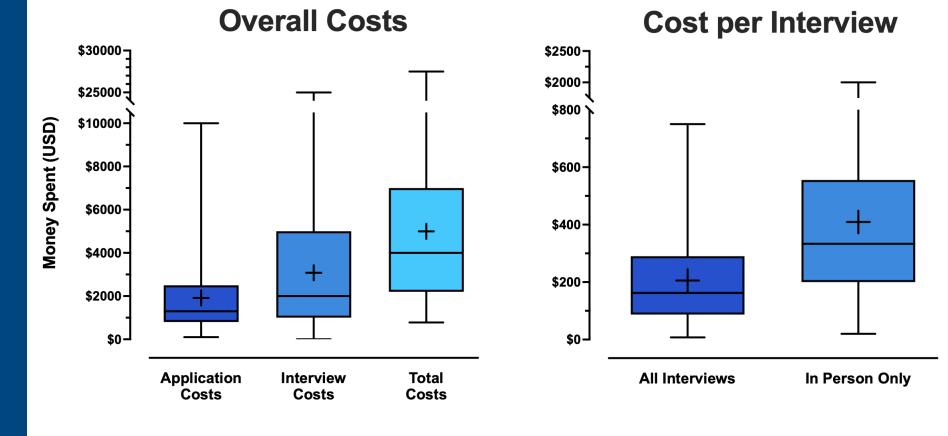
