Conference attendees will include senior leaders of mental health and substance use treatment provider organizations, health systems, human resources professionals, provider networks, county and regional authorities, state provider associations and people with lived experience. Educate your peers and contribute to the field of mental wellbeing by submitting a presentation proposal for consideration!

How to Submit

To submit an abstract, go to the <u>Scorecard Homepage</u> and complete the online form. You may begin the submission process and return to your saved proposal any time prior to the submission deadline. **All proposals must be submitted online.**

All applications must be received no later than 11:59 p.m. PT Friday, October 8, 2021.

Session Formats

Proposals are being accepted for the following formats: workshop presentations, poster presentations, TED-style talks and Ignite presentations and iPoster presentations. (You will be asked to specify desired session format during the submittal process.)

- Workshop Presentations: Workshop presentations last one hour, including Q&A. They are interactive and have a scope beyond individual programs. Workshops focus on emerging trends, creative concepts and new solutions that benefit the field and shape the future. Workshop Presentations may have one presenter, multiple presenters or can be formulated as a panel. No more than three panelists and one moderator are permitted.
- **TED-style Talk and Ignite Sessions:** TED-style Talks are short, powerful talks on riveting topics lasting just 18 minutes or less. Ignite sessions are exactly five minutes with 20 auto-advancing, highly visual slides, allowing presenters to share their passions in riveting, moving and memorable ways. Think beyond your work and the field to stories that will excite and inspire audiences. Did you grow your most successful vegetable garden this year? Tell us about it! Did you learn something new about yourself while renovating your home? Maybe your children taught you a valuable lesson while learning virtually themselves. Outside the box is what we are looking for.
- **iPoster Presentations:** iPosters presentations are interactive electronic poster displays of innovative practices and award-winning programs that can include the latest in research and data. These electronic posters are available to be viewed on screens throughout the duration conference by attendees. Up to two authors are scheduled at a select time to present their information and answer questions about their poster.
- NatCon22 Shark Tank: Shark Tank presentations highlight new technologies that represent the future of health care, illustrate innovations that are applicable to mental health an substance use providers, demonstrate the potential for improved outcomes and inspire attendees to apply what they learn to their own organizations.
 Selected participants will compete for the opportunity to win the \$10,000 grand prize awarded by innovaTel Telepsychiatry.

Selection Criteria

NatCon22 seeks educational sessions that highlight concepts that are <u>practical, replicable and relevant</u> for the attendees.

The process to accept workshops, posters, TED-style sessions or Ignite sessions is very selective. There are limited slots available, and the final decision is at the discretion of the National Council. General sessions and thought leader sessions are determined solely by the National Council. If a proposal warrants a general session or thought leader session, instead of a workshop, the National Council will make that determination and inform the submitter.

The following criteria will be used by the National Council to select presentations:

- Originality: NatCon includes only unique end exciting content that reflects our dynamic community.
- Relevance: All sessions are of great interest to attendees and clearly benefit attendees' professional needs.
- **Presentation Design:** All sessions incorporate good practices for adult education, with clear learning objectives that are measurable and achievable.
- Outcomes: All sessions must demonstrate strong outcomes.
- **Ability to Inspire Action:** Content experts who present at NatCon inspire attendees to return to their organizations and implement what they learn.
- Overall Quality: NatCon learning opportunities meet the highest standards of excellence.

All proposals must be complete, comprehensive, and deemed relevant and timely to the conference's audience. The National Council may shorten a presentation, increase and/or reduce the number of presenters, select alternate



presenters from among those proposed, and/or combine the submitted presentation with other proposed presentations, at its sole discretion. All presenters will be contacted independently to confirm their submittal.

Notifications

Once you have submitted your proposal, you can expect:

- 1. Acknowledgement: Upon receipt of your submission, you will receive an email acknowledgement.
- 2. Notification: You will be notified about the status of your presentation by December 1, 2021.
- 3. **Follow-up**: If selected to present, the National Council will contact presenters to discuss each presentation in detail, bringing together both presenters and moderators and will help presenters determine AV needs and manage presentation materials.
 - a. **Session Presenters:** All accepted presenters will get information on how to access the Speaker Resource Center (SRC). Presenters will be required to log into the SRC to confirm participation in the conference, provide a presentation description, three (3) measurable learning objectives, references and a few additional items by the given due dates.
 - b. iPoster Presenters: All accepted iPoster presenters will receive information on how to log into the NatCon iPoster system to build the digital poster. All presenters will be assigned a 30-minute presentation time during the conference to engage in an informal presentation and Q&A session with attendees.

Reminder: Poster presentations must be educational in nature and may not be used to market products or services.

Note: The submitting author must provide a valid e-mail address as the National Council will rely exclusively on e-mail communications related to abstract submission, disposition, and presentation. It is the responsibility of the submitting author to contact The National Council in the event of failure to receive e-mail communication and to relay all correspondence about the abstract(s) to all co-author(s). Please check your bulk/junk mail folders to ensure e-mails from The National Council are not being filtered out of your inbox.
